✓ Make and send (or give) a Valentine's Day Card

- Warm up with some simple flashcards or show a short video clip, such as Charlie Brown at <u>http://canada-esl.com/happy-valentines-day-charlie-brown/esl-themes-and-holidays/winter-esl-lessons/</u>
- **Go to** wherever they sell cards, e.g. Superstore, London Drugs, and have students find the Valentine's Card selection. Ask them to notice the sections of the intended recipient of the card:
 - Are there special V-Day cards for wife/husband? for children to give each other? for grandparents? etc.
- Have students **select someone** to give a card to (a real person in their life).
- Use a printable template, such as on <u>http://www.mes-english.com/flashcards/holidays.php</u>, use_an e-card or have students use cardstock paper and markers to **create their own Valentine's Day card**.
- **Teach the language** appropriate for writing in a V-Day card (keep it simple for the lower levels).
