

## Tools for Teaching Multilevel Classes

### Add Ventures Series

If you are finding that the levels of your students in your ELSA class are quite varied, the Cambridge Ventures series may be helpful. The Venture series has 5 different levels, from literacy to level 4 (CLB 1-6 according to the Cambridge website), of student's books, but it also has the accompanying *Add Ventures* multilevel worksheets. These worksheets give students more practice with the content and vocabulary of each lesson, but at three different levels: at level, below level and above level. The 3 leveled worksheets look very similar, and the answers are the same, so instructors don't need 3 different answer keys.
