## What's New at the Centre for Canadian Language Benchmarks? An update from Marianne Kayed



The results of the National Consultation are now completed. The consultants' report is available on the CCLB website at [http://language.ca/display\\_page.asp?page\\_id=895](http://language.ca/display_page.asp?page_id=895). Strategic directions for CCLB are also available there.

Revisions of the CLB and NCLC document are now underway and a revised draft is due to be completed in June, 2010. The revision is based on recommendations from the National Consultation that informed an Action Plan that was

developed by CLB experts in December and incorporated into a work plan. Citizenship & Immigration Canada (CIC) is funding the revision. The Centre is planning to validate the revised CLB document after June 2010, once funding is confirmed.

topics.


