

IV. Comprehending Information

 Understand descriptive or narrative monologues or presentations related to everyday, personally relevant topics or situations.

Task Listen to a short news report about transportation to determine advantages and disadvantages of a proposal.

Tool Student Comments - Self-assessment

The following example is based on the theme of transportation. The tool can be used for any activity or task.

- 1. Record a news item from CBC Radio about the issues with the Skytrain expansion. Make sure that the recording is no more than 5 minutes in length.
- 2. Develop questions for the news recording make sure they are questions based on factual details, but also some questions on implied meanings.
- 3. Review the pros and cons of different modes of transportation. Be sure to pre-teach any specific difficult vocabulary you think needs to be covered before listening to the text.
- 4. Give the Ss a chance to listen to the recording at least 2 times.
- 5. Ss answer the questions. Go over the answers with the Ss, being sure to replay the section where the answer is located so Ss can hear it for themselves.
- 6. Organize Ss into groups. Instruct groups to list the advantages and disadvantages outlined in the news story and come to a consensus in favor of or against the proposal.
- 7. Have each group present to the class and have a whole class discussion.
- 8. Instruct Ss to write comments about the activity:
 - a. Was it easy/difficult?
 - b. What questions were most challenging?
 - c. What could Ss do to improve their performance next time?
 - d. What would be helpful to cover in future classes?

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I found this to be quite easy. The most challenging question to answer was about how the Mayor felt about the situation. I got most of the questions correct, so I don't think I need to improve. I think we need longer, more difficult listening exercises.
