- **Task** Read an announcement of a community event to decide whether or not to attend by reviewing purpose, formality, details about the occasion and expectations of participants.

- 1. Have the Ss read the community announcement about the New Westminster Culture Crawl provided, or find a similar text announcing an event in your community.
- 2. As they read the text, have the Ss answer the questions.
- 3. Once they have completed the task, collect their completed questions.
- 4. As you review their answers, make note of what type of question (e.g. purpose, audience, tone, inference) Ss have most difficulty with. Record your results on a record sheet. These can be shared with individual Ss, but also analyzed with the class as a whole so that you are able to incorporate activities in future lessons that can address the difficulties Ss may be experiencing.
