

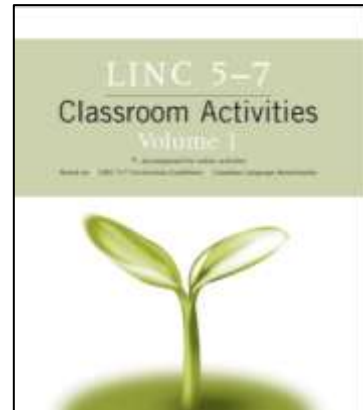

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Authentic, Web-based Resources

Both the ELSA 6/7 Regular and the ELSA 6/7 for Smaller Communities curricula are based on authentic, web-based resources. Why?

- Authentic means the language has not been graded for ESL learners; at CLB 6-8, students should be able to handle most authentic language.
- Web-based means it is free (except printing costs if needed)
- Most resources on the internet can be used without permission
