

## IV. Sharing Information

• Give basic descriptions of concrete, familiar objects in a few short words or phrases.

**Task** Describe a person to a classmate. The classmate listens and guesses who it is.

**Tool** Anecdotal Record – Labels (or Sticky Notes)

- 1. Review with Ss how to describe people.
- 2. Assess whether Ss can accurately describe a picture of a person.
- 3. Divide Ss into pairs.
- 4. Distribute pictures of people Ss may know in the school (e.g., teachers, teaching assistants, volunteers, program assistants, managers, receptionists, etc.). Glue the pictures onto cardstock so their partner can't peek.
- 5. Have Ss randomly choose a picture.
- 6. Have Ss describe the person in the picture to their partners.
- 7. Have the partners listen and take notes (e.g., "short brown hair, glasses, round face, short, heavy, brown eyes, etc.).
- 8. Have the partners guess who the person is based on the description.
- 9. When finished, have Ss switch roles and select a new picture.



The picture is of a woman. She has straight brown hair. She has brown eyes and wears glasses.

She has a round face.

- 10. Using labels, or sticky notes, circulate and make notes on Ss' progress:
  - Are Ss using the target vocabulary?
  - o Is the pronunciation clear?
  - o Are there grammar issues?
  - Can partners understand the description?
- 11. Use this information to revisit problem areas in future classes.
